Milan, 30th November, [1771]

I never believed I would still be in Milan now, but it is the circumstances¹ which are still holding me back, and in Salzburg it is the *Advent* season anyway, with no music at court. [5] The plan is therefore still that I will reach Salzburg in the first fortnight of *December*. Yes, if I leave here on the 2nd or 3rd of *December*, I can with God's help comfortably be in Salzburg on the 9th or 10th. We are well, praise God. That is the best news I can give to you, although it is quite exceptionally cold here, with the most beautiful weather. [10] I will find your letters in *Verona* if you have in fact written any more. For now you certainly need not write anymore. In the hope of seeing you soon, we kiss you both many 10 000 000 times and am as always your

MOZART'S POSTSCRIPT TO HIS SISTER:

So that you two do not think that I am ill, I am writing these two lines to you. Keep well. My handkiss to Mama. My compliments to all good friends. [20] I saw 4 fellows hanged here on the cathedral square. They hang here as they do in *Lion*. Wolfgang
