0116.¹ LEOPOLD MOZART TO LORENZ HAGENAUER,² SALZBURG

Vienna, 22nd September, 1767

Some news of our health will already have been given to you by Frau Reifenstul³ and also by Christian, the servant of General Platz.⁴ On the first day we drove as far as Vöckelpruck,⁵ on the second day, at midday, [5] to Lambach⁶ |: where we had our midday meal in the monastery :| and in the evening drove to Linz. We would even have continued our journey direct from the church, but that the Prelate of Lambach invited us to take our midday meal there. We stayed at the Green Tree⁷ in the suburb and since the monastery in Lambach was just close by, I let him know of my arrival even though it was 9 o'clock in the evening. [10] On Sunday we went no further than the Strengberg and on Monday afternoon to Melck,⁸ where we went up to the monastery after the meal, let them show us the rooms, and did not reveal our identities until, while we were looking at the church and the *organ*, we gave the *organist* the opportunity of recognising, or rather guessing, Wolfie-in-Sheep's-Clothing's⁹ identity from his playing. [15] Immediately afterwards, however, we were sitting in the coach and driving to St. Pelten,¹⁰ and on the next day we drove to Burckerstorf¹¹ and Vienna.¹²

Concerning the Main Customs Office, I will only say that everything was examined, down to the bone marrow, and that I was held up for over an hour. [20] You will not have my address yet. It is in the <u>Weihburggasse at Carivolti¹³ House, care of Herr Schmalecker¹⁴ on the 2nd floor.¹⁵ But it will be better to send any letters to Herr *Peisser*.¹⁶ I cannot yet report anything at all regarding our business. His Majesty the Emperor¹⁷ has only just come back from Hungary, and Her Majesty the Empress¹⁸ had devotions in these days [25] because of the death of our blessed Emperor,¹⁹ devotions which she conducts every month. Daily, by the way, they have either *opera seria* or *opera buffa* or theatre.²⁰ On Sunday, there was a *ball* given by the Neapolitan ambassador, and tomorrow, the 23rd, there will be *illuminations*, a *ball* and fireworks in Liechtenstein Gardens. I hope, by the way, sir, you are in good health.</u>

[30] I cannot possibly write any more, this pen is cursedly miserable. We all commend ourselves.

I forgot to lay aside for Herr Joseph²¹ the things which should have been sent to my brother. Now it is too late. Should there be an opportunity, it would be that certain <u>brown</u>, <u>yellowish coat</u> [35] which hangs on the clothes stand in the little interior chamber or is lying on the bed. And on the ground lie 2 little packages in fleece paper tied with string: these are also part of it. With the address Herr *Joseph Ignatius Mozart*,²² public bookbinder in Augsburg, in the Affenwald.²³
