[5] Yesterday Herr Esser² called on me for the first time – did he go on foot in Salzburg? – or did he always drive around in the coach as he does here? – I believe the little bit of Salzburg money³ will not want to stay in his purse. – On Sunday we eat together at *Cannabich's*,⁴ and there he will have to let us hear his clever and clownish solos. – He says he is not giving a *concert* here [10] – nor does he want to perform at court – and is not seeking to do so – If the Elector⁵ does want to hear him, *Eh bien*⁶ – I am here – this will be a distinction for me; – but – I am not announcing myself –

Otherwise he may be a good-hearted clown – by the devil, I meant to say knight – he once asked me why I do not wear the spur⁷ – [15] I said it was hard enough for me to carry the one in my head; – he was so kind as to brush down my suit a little while I was wearing it and said: One knight must indeed serve another. - Despite that, quite certainly out of forgetfulness, he did indeed leave his spur |: I mean the external one - the visible one :| at home when he came to Cannabich's that same afternoon, [20] or at least knew how to hide it so well that one did not catch even the least glimpse of it. - Now quickly so that I do not forget it again: - Mad:^{me} and Mad:^{selle} Cannabich have gradually started to develop slightly thicker necks because of the air and water here; the latest was that it could even become a goitre – God preserve us! – [25] they are taking a certain powder, though, what do you call it? - but that's not its name. - No; - but it is not turning out to anyone's contendrement⁸ at all for which reason I took the liberty of recommending the so-called goitre pills, telling a story |: in order to raise the value of these pills: | that my sister had had 3 goitres; - each bigger than the one before – – and then was nevertheless finally [30] entirely free of it thanks to these splendid pills – if they can be made up here, I ask for the prescription – – but if they can only be made in our town – I would ask you to send me some hundredweights of them with the next post-coach against cash payment – you know my address.

All that about the Electress⁹ is a first-rate lie – [35] because the Empress¹⁰ has now died, people believe it is spreading from one great woman to the next – The Margrave of Anspach, ¹¹ too, has already been declared dead. – The Emperor¹² is said to have had a fall –
