Please forgive me for not informing you last post-day that I had received the cadenzas,<sup>2</sup> for which I must obediently thank you. – But that was exactly on my name-day – in the morning, therefore, I carried out my devotions and - just as I wanted to write, I was encumbered by a crowd coming to congratulate me – at 12 o'clock I drove to Leopoldstadt<sup>3</sup> to Baronne Waldstädten<sup>4</sup> [10] – where I spent my name-day. At 11 o'clock in the evening, I was given a night music with 2 clarinets, 2 horns and 2 bassoons - and indeed of my own composition.<sup>5</sup> – I had written this music for St. Theresia's Day – for the sister of Frau von Hickl, or the sister-in-law of Herr von Hickel |: Court Painter :|, which is also where it was really performed for the first time. [15] – The 6 gentlemen who perform do such things are poor devils, but make a very fine wind sound together, especially the first *clarinettist* and the 2 hunting horn players. – But the main reason why I wrote it was to let Herr von Strack |: who is there every day: hear something of mine. And for that reason too I wrote it half reasonably. – [20] It also met with applause all round. – They performed it in three different places on the evening of St. Theresia's Day. – For when they were finished in one place, they were led off somewhere else and paid. – The gentlemen therefore had the house door opened and, after they had taken up position in the middle of the courtyard, just when I wanted to undress, I was surprised in the most pleasant way in the world with the first  $E^b$  chord.

I will write the 2<sup>nd</sup> clavier part into the cadenzas and then send them back again. –

It would certainly be good if my *opera*<sup>6</sup> were ready now, for now Umlauf<sup>7</sup> cannot put his on because *Mad*:<sup>me</sup> Weiss<sup>8</sup> and *Mad*:<sup>selle</sup> Schindler are ill.

[30] - Now I must go to Stephani straight away because he has finally said that something is ready. -

I do not know of anything new at all to write to you about – for bagatelles cannot interest you, and matters of significance – you will already know as well as we do in Vienna. – That a *Dauphin*<sup>9</sup> now exists – may indeed also be – [35] for the moment at least, a bagatelle – until it turns into a bigatelle. <sup>10</sup> – I wrote this here so as not to leave the *Duc d'Artois* alone with the honour of a *bon mot*, <sup>11</sup> for he once said to the Queen, when she complained during her pregnancy, that the Dauphin was causing her trouble: *il me donne des grands Coups de*

Now, on the day when the news came, all theatres and spectacles were free. – and now – it is chiming three o'clock – therefore I must hurry to Stephani, otherwise I will no longer find him in – then I can wait again. – [45] I hope you will find yourself in better health from day to day, and the same to my dear sister, whom I embrace with my whole heart. – May life go well for you, I kiss your hands 1000 times and am, sir, eternally your
