Mon très cher père!<sup>2</sup>

<u>Vienna</u>, 8<sup>th</sup> May, <u>1784</u>.

Menzl³ left all at once and was no longer able to find me at home, so I could not give him a letter to take – he will hopefully have called on you by now. [5] I deliberately did not give him the promised *musique* to take with him, for I am much too anxious about it. – I prefer to send it with the post-coach. – Perhaps my good friend <u>Richter</u> really is with you now. – If this is so, I would expressly ask you to pass on our compliments. – Now I must go down to the first floor to a *concert* given by Frau von Trattner⁴ [10] – for which I was *entrusted* with organising everything – I therefore cannot write anything more – other than that we are both in fine fettle and hope that the same is true of both of you. – Now <u>Paesello</u>⁵ is here, come back again from Russia, – he will write an *opera* here. Sarti⁶ is expected any day, travelling through here to get to Russia. – I am looking forward to the buckles. <sup>7</sup> – [15] May life go well for you, we both kiss your hands and embrace our dear sister from the heart, and are, sir, eternally your

obedient children W. A. Mozart mp<sup>8</sup>
