EXCERPT: Vienna, 11th June, 1806

.... But now I am busy sending you as much music as I can; only I cannot send the scores you desire from me because I do not have them myself. The only score I have is your father's *Requiem*, ² [5] which you are also to have because I have found an opportunity for someone to take it with them. Along with it you will receive, as an enclosure, some numbers *in parti* from *Clemenza*³ until another opportunity presents itself. In the meantime write telling me everything you have by your father, and whether you could perhaps make use of anything else by him . . . Last week, Nanette Lange⁴ appeared for the first time as *Zerlina* in *don giovani*. [10] She was liked pretty well, but I fear that she has come to the theatre too late, for she does not have a big voice and at her age one does not develop one anymore
